

THE CORRECT CHRONOLOGICAL ORDER OF THE OLD TESTAMENT (TENAKH)

The very text of the Old Testament is commonly printed in the wrong order. The true Hebrew chronological order of the Bible is not as printed, in most Bibles today. It is (per The Complete Jewish Bible), as follows:

If you consider that this is the order of the writings that Yeshua had to read from, you will see that we are mixed up in our order, and it causes problems of understanding. Remember the scrolls of old had no chapters and verses separated out. If you start reading a book half way through or watching a movie from the end to the beginning you can understand why there is difficulty in understanding the Old Testament for so many people today. The scrolls that Yeshua, Paul, Peter, etc., read from, were in Hebrew chronological order, not Greek; it does as you see, make a serious difference. Paul, Peter, Yeshua, etc., were Jewish, so naturally they spoke to the people first and foremost in Hebrew as explained earlier.

The following is a list of some of the so-called “lost” books of Canon that were never accepted in the Bible:

Adam and Eve, Mary, Infancy, Nicodemus, Barnabus, Polycarp, Hermas, Enoch, Thomas, Jasher, The Assumption Of Moses, and The Antiquities Of Philo.

The apocrypha books are: First Esdras, Second Esdras, Tobit, Judith, The Additions To Esther, The Wisdom Of Solomon, Ecclesiasticus (or The Wisdom of Jesus, the Son Of Sirach), Baruch, The Letter of Jeremiah, The Prayer of Azariah and the Song of the Three Young Men, Susanna, Bel and the Dragon, The Prayer of Manasseh, First Maccabees, and Second Maccabees.

THE CORRECT CHRONOLOGICAL ORDER OF THE RENEWED TESTAMENT

The following is the chronological order of the new Hebraic Roots Version Bible, put out by the Institute for scriptures research, made available in spring of 2008:

As seen above, James (Yeshua’s step brother), and Peter should be at the front of the Renewed testament. They were there at least 30-50 years before Paul. They were eye witnesses, Paul was not.

It is a well known fact that the order of the Books of our Bible has been incorrect for hundreds of years. **If the translators have lied to us for all these years about the simple order of the books of the Bible, why, would any intelligent person trust their work in the rest of our good book.** We must appraise all things ourselves. Therefore all those with spiritual discernment must seriously ponder how many other obvious errors in the Bible need to be checked out. There are MANY such blatant errors, that is why we can’t trust the translations. They are not in the original Hebrew. We must look at them all together and ask the author; the Holy Spirit, to reveal to us the true meaning of the Word of Yahveh. Yah Himself said in **Jer. 17:5 “cursed is the man who trusts in mankind”**.

Most of the things I have pointed out so far in this book are actually common knowledge to most theologians, scholars, teachers, and preachers. It is not news!

What really bothers me is the fact that over the last several hundred years of Bible translations. It seems no one has taken the time to correct the mistakes and errors of chronological order. Why is this do you think? Who do you think is behind this? You do the math.

The only effort I have seen worth mentioning is that of David Stern in his “Complete Jewish Bible” translation. At least he managed to put the Old Testament books in the right order and corrected many of the titles and the name of the Most High.
