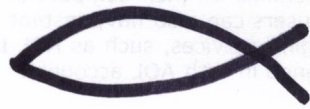


FISH SYMBOL



Dagon

The fish symbol may be from the dagon god of the Roman Catholics. That would be occultic. It was used in the religion of Mithras. It was brought forward from the Persians of the god Dagon with his fish hat. It was the same as what you see on the heads of the Pope and other top men of the Roman Catholic Church even today. When you see the tall hat, look at it from the side and it appears to be a fish head with the long cape the fish body and tail.
