

# THE WORD (YESHUA) WAS WITH YAH, THE WORD WAS YAH

John 1:1-2 *"In the beginning was the Word, and **the Word was with Yah, and the Word was Yah.** He was in the beginning with Yah."* Yeshua was the Word (TORAH) in the flesh. Yeshua (Torah) was/is the light of the world. To paraphrase: "In the beginning was Yeshua (Torah), and Yeshua was with Yah, and Yeshua was Yah, He was in the beginning with Yah". For more understanding, see Gen. 1:3,14 revelation. Most people that go to a church for the first time and supposedly accept Messiah into their hearts, are told to start reading the bible. They are told to start at John 1:1. They should of course be told to start at Genesis, but in John 1:1 they are actually being pointed back to Genesis. John 1:1 is a commentary on the book of Genesis. It's as if Yah knew this was going to happen.

I believe this verse is closely associated with Ezekiel's Wheel vision. I believe the hub of the wheel is being referred to and that the Torah represents the truth, life, and spirit of the wheel. In order to make a wheel, one must start out first with the hub. The hub is our Torah, our Tree of Life in the Garden. Yah's word is circular. He tells us in His word the end is revealed in the beginning. This may be represented by the wheel within a wheel. The beginning and the end are joined together in a circular motion. Yah's Word (Yeshua) is the aleph and tav, beginning and end. Everything in the bible is actually revealed in Gen. 1-4 if one looks closely. In Genesis Yah revealed Revelation. Exodus Part One to Exodus Part two. This is the main reason why Satan manages to get most pro-claimed christians to avoid reading the Tenakh. He knows that everything in the end is revealed in the Old Testament, so if he can keep them (the SUNday church people) from reading the Tenakh, he will succeed in keeping them blind.

The Torah as a whole is based on a very simple concept that every human being can relate to. The concept is house (home), family, and land to have a crop. Every person understands this simplistic concept. The Torah is an agricultural idea, sewing and harvesting. Those who have grown a garden understand the concept of the seeds being planted to bare fruit and weeds coming in to cover up and destroy the fruit of the seed. If we are successful planters we will have fruit, family, a piece of land to work and call our own, and a home. This is a simple idea that all can relate to. Yeshua gives us the seed to plant (Torah), and Satan comes along as a weed (quack grass) to overgrow the plant so it can produce nothing. The endless battle between good and evil.
