

## DIVORCE

Luke 16:18 (see also Matt. 5:31-32, Mark 10:11-12)

**Luke 16:18** *"Everyone who divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery; and he who marries one who is divorced from a husband commits **adultery**."* Divorce (get in Hebrew), is a gimel and tav. At no place in scripture will you find those two letters sitting beside each other. It is so negative a thought, you will not even find it in scripture. The torah doesn't say much about divorce. It only says if a married couple divorce they can never go back and marry each other again.

**Deut. 24:1-4** *"When a man takes a wife and marries her, and it happens that she finds no favor in his eyes because he has found some indecency in her, and he writes her a certificate of divorce and puts it in her hand and sends her out from his house, 2 and she leaves his house and goes and becomes another man's wife, 3 and if the latter husband turns against her and writes her a certificate of divorce and puts it in her hand and sends her out of his house, or if the latter husband dies who took her to be his wife, 4 **then her former husband who sent her away is not allowed to take her again to be his wife, since she has been defiled; for that is an abomination before the LORD, and you shall not bring sin on the land which the LORD your God gives you as an inheritance.**"*



Keep in mind that Moses taught about the get and Moses himself experienced it first hand. At the time of Yeshua there was a trend taking place among married men. Men would marry a women, have children, and after the children had grown up, they would take on other women in their mid age crisis and start over again. They would re-marry. Yeshua was trying to tell them that if they did such things they were still committing adultery. He was telling them this was not acceptable. If they did this, getting re-married would not cover the sin of divorce for an inappropriate reason. They thought if they had an affair but ended up getting married again made the sin mute. Yeshua called this situation

"hardness of the heart", not infidelity as many would have you believe. It could include infidelity, or other things, but it was described as hardness of the heart. Luke 17:33-37 (see also Matt. 24:40-42)

***“Whoever seeks to keep his life shall lose it, and whoever loses his life shall preserve it. 34 “I tell you, on that night there will be two men in one bed; one will be taken, and the other will be left. 35 “There will be two women grinding at the same place; one will be taken, and the other will be left. 36 [“Two men will be in the field; one will be taken and the other will be left.”] 37 And answering they \*said to Him, “Where, Lord?” And He said to them, “Where the body is, there also will the vultures be gathered.”*** These verses are talking about what was to come in the last days. The first part of this passage is where Yeshua is speaking about how to be an overcomer in the great tribulation. If in the great tribulation, one attempts to go out and save your own life by whatever means you will indeed not save your own life, you will lose it. The whole nature during the tribulation will cause us to trust in Yah. There are three destiny's during the tribulation; those who are destined to captivity, captivity they will go, those who take up the sword shall die by the sword, and those who escape will endure to the end. In verse 33 Yeshua is talking specifically about that third category of people, those who will escape. In verse 37 He is referring to the gathering of those who will be judged from those who have been judged, for Armageddon. It is not talking about any rapture or escaping. It's talking about Yah gathering His enemies at Armageddon (the Day of the Lord), and destroying them. In Matthew we see two harvests, one of the righteous and one of the wicked (Matt. 13:49). Here we see him talking about the harvest of the wicked and the feast the vultures have on their dead bodies. You will see Luke being more specific about these things later in chapter twenty one.
