

## BLIND BARTIMAEUS

**Mark 10:46-52** (see also Luke 18:35 & Matt. 20:29-34) *And they came to Jericho. And as He was going out from Jericho with His disciples and a great multitude, a blind beggar named Bartimaeus, the son of Timaeus, was sitting by the road. And when he heard that it was Yeshua the Nazarene, he began to cry out and say, "Yeshua, Son of David, have mercy on me!" 48 And many were sternly telling him to be quiet, but he kept crying out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" And Yeshua stopped and said, "Call him here." And they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take courage, arise! He is calling for you." **And casting aside his cloak**, he jumped up, and came to Yeshua. 51 And answering him, Yeshua said, "What do you want Me to do for you?" And the blind man said to Him, "Rabboni, I want to regain my sight!" And Yeshua said to him, "Go your way; your faith has made you well." And immediately he regained his sight and began following Him on the road.*

Beggar's in those days had to have a license to beg and then they had a certain color of garment they had to wear for begging. The garment that was referred in verse 50 was actually referring to this cloak. In throwing away his garment Bartimeaus was actually saying, he believed in Yeshua the living healing Torah and was no longer a beggar.
