

## YESHUA RESURRECTED

Num. 10:35-36 (nun drawn forward..tittle) *Then it came about when the ark set out that Moses said, "Rise up, O LORD! And let Thine enemies be scattered, And let those who hate Thee flee before Thee."* 36 *And when it came to rest, he said, "Return Thou, O LORD, To the **myriad thousands** of Israel."* (nun drawn backwards..tittle).



If you look at the original scrolls of the book of Numbers you will see that at the end of chapter 10, verse 34 there is a tittle, the picture of nun, a fish drawn forward. In Hebrew this means; "quicken of life". This tittle separates verse 34 from 35 in a very distinctive way. The text in the brackets is separate from the other text. At the end of verse 35 you will also see the same tittle but drawn backwards, which means the "quicken of life from the dead, resurrection". What this is doing is distinctly setting aside these two specific verses as being very special and of great importance. The scribes at that time didn't know why they were to do this, but those who understand biblical prophesy can see that these two verses were telling the events of Calvary in the Book of Numbers, thousands of years in advance. Many Rabbis say these two verses are the most important of all verses in the torah without them even realizing who is being revealed here. Yeshua is the one being referred to here as being resurrected. In verse 35 it is talking about myriads of thousands. Myriads of thousands was the term (idiom) used in Hebrew to mean huge numbers un-comprehensible to man at that time, like the descendants of Abraham being as grains of sand or as stars in the sky. The term was used to define millions, the greatest possible number, way beyond anything you can imagine. The people of Israel, or the bride, some day would be "myriads of thousands". All Israel. We are the resurrection referred to here as myriads of thousands. This is describing the born again saints who believe in the second coming.
