
THE PEOPLE OF THE NATIONS WILL BE GRASPING THE GARMENT OF A JEW TO LEARN THE TRUTH

Zech. 8:23 "Thus says Adonai of hosts, 'In those days ten **men from all the nations will grasp the garment of a Jew** saying, "Let us go with you, for we have heard that Yahveh is with you.""



The garment referred to here is the tzit-zit (tassels) on the corner of the tallit. As the people grabbed onto Yeshua's tzit-zit to be healed and delivered so will people in later days learn to respect the uniform of Believers, the prayer shawl. The tzit-zit represents the commandments of the Torah. If you grab hold of the tzit-tzit, you are symbolically accepting the commandments as your guide. The Jewish people are the living oracles of the Torah. The Jewish people know the Torah like no others and when they accept Yeshua as their Messiah in later years, they will be our living guides. (Matt. 9:20-22, 14:36) The ten to one ratio is also very significant. It probably symbolizes the possibility that for every ten Gentiles saved in the later days (including proclaimed SUNday Christians), there will be one Orthodox Jew that accepts Yeshua as his messiah.
