THE FOURTEEN GENERATIONS OF YESHUA

Abraham and Sarah laughed when Yah told them they would have a son at her age. This was impossible and yet it happened. This was a shadow of what was to come with Yeshua. It was the impossible, yet it happened. A virgin gave birth to a baby. Joseph had nothing to do with the kingly line. Joseph was not related to Yeshua in any way, even if he was really his step-father, right?

As per the common copies of the Greek translations of the New Testament, there is no genealogical link between Yeshua and David. If He is not of the line of David, Yeshua can't be the Messiah spoken of.

Matt. 1:1-17 It talks about 14 generations, three times. Here we go.

The record of the genealogy of Yeshua the Messiah, the son of David, the son of Abraham:

Matt. 1:2 Abraham (first gen) was the father of Isaac, (2nd) Isaac the father of Jacob, and Jacob (3rd) the father of Judah (4th) and his brothers.

Matt. 1:3 Judah was the father of Perez (5th) and Zerah by Tamar, (6th) Perez was the father of Hezron, and Hezron (7th) the father of Ram.

Matt. 1:4 Ram was the father of Amminadab, (8th) Amminadab the father of Nahshon, (9th) and Nahshon the father of Salmon.

Matt. 1:5 Salmon (10th) was the father of Boaz (11th) by Rahab, Boaz was the father of Obed by Ruth, (12th) and Obed the father of Jesse. (13th)

Matt. 1:6 Jesse was the father of David the king.(14th)

All these work out.

David (1rst) was the father of Solomon by Bathsheba who had been the wife of Uriah.

Matt. 1:7 Solomon was the father of Rehoboam, (2nd) Rehoboam the father of Abijah, (3rd) and Abijah the father of Asa.

Matt. 1:8 Asa (4th) was the father of Jehoshaphat, Jehoshaphat (5th) the father of Joram, (6th) and Joram the father of Uzziah.(7th)

Matt. 1:9 Uzziah was the father of Jotham, Jotham (8th) the father of Ahaz, (9th) and Ahaz the father of Hezekiah. (10th)

Matt. 1:10 Hezekiah was the father of Manasseh, (11th) Manasseh the father of Amon, and Amon (12th) the father of Josiah.(13th)

Matt. 1:11 Josiah became the father of Jeconiah (14th) and his brothers, at the time of the deportation to Babylon.

All these work out.

Matt. 1:12 After the deportation to Babylon: Jeconiah became the father of Shealtiel, (1rst) and Shealtiel the father of Zerubbabel.(2nd)

Matt. 1:13 Zerubbabel was the father of Abihud, Abihud (3rd) the father of Eliakim, (4th) and Eliakim the father of Azor.

Matt. 1:14 Azor (5th) was the father of Zadok, (6th) Zadok the father of Achim, and Achim (7th) the father of Eliud.

Matt. 1:15 Eliud (8th) was the father of Eleazar, Eleazar (9th) the father of Matthan, and Matthan (10th) the father of Jacob. (11th)

Matt. 1:16 Jacob was the father of Joseph (12th) the husband of Mary, by whom Yeshua was born, who is called the Messiah. (13th)

We have a problem here, we are one generation short.

Matt. 1:17 So all the generations from Abraham to David are **fourteen generations**; from David to the deportation to Babylon, fourteen generations; and from the deportation to Babylon to the Messiah, fourteen generations.

Luke 3:23 When He began His ministry, Yeshua Himself was about thirty years of age, being, as was supposed, the son of Joseph, the son of Eli,

Notice what it says: "as was supposed" This is Josephs lineage, Mary isn't even talked about here. In Hebrew society the racial genetics come through the mother, not the father. To be considered Jewish ones mother had to be Jewish.

Look at the following closely, a comparison of what the Matthew and Luke scrolls say:

Matthew Luke Yeshua Yeshua Joseph Joseph Jacob Heli Mattham Mathat Eleazar Levi Eliud Melchi Achim Janna Sadoc Joseph

Matthew and Luke don't line up!!!!!!!

As per the KJV, there is no lineage from King David to Yeshua, only 13 generations.

The Hebrew Aramaic original scrolls of Matthew read: Matt. 1:16 Jacob (11) begat Joseph (12) the FATHER of Miriam (13) of whom was born Yeshua (14) who is called Messiah.
