

## FISH SYMBOL



The fish symbol represents multiple gods of the occult, the main one being the Dagon god of the Roman Catholics, known by various names such as Oannes, Nimrod, Ichthys, Leviathan, or even Freya and Frigg. It was also used in the religion of Mithras. It was brought forward from the Persians of the god Dagon with his fish hat. It was the same hat you see on the heads of the Pope and other top demonic priests of the Roman Catholic Church even today. When you see the tall hat, look at it from the side and it appears to be a fish head with the long cape the fish body and tail.

If you look at the letter "nun" in Hebrew you will find an action word pictured as a fish. In Aramaic this symbol was said to be secretly used to represent the Messianic's in the first century. Many fools with no knowledge of what the Bible says, say Yeshua was referring to the fish symbol as the sign of Jonah. This is why many Christians claim it represents Christianity.

Many claim that years ago Christians hid in the catacombs of Rome to avoid execution. Christians did not worship nor hide in the catacombs of Rome. In recent years it has been thought that this myth was created by the church of Rome and archaeologists have seen that this was not correct. When in Rome a guide can show you the catacombs and explain the story and show you how this error is not really possible to have been right. One of the main points is that if they had really been in these catacombs they would have all been slaughtered by the Roman legions. All the tunnels and chambers were mapped out and well known.



In the sixth century Catholic priests were sent to Europe to convert pagans there. All over Europe they found heathens celebrating June 24th. Many heathens claimed that this date was dedicated to the fish god Oannes (also known as Nimrod). Because John the Baptist was known to have been born about six months before Yeshua, (Luke 1:26, 36) and the date of June the 24th. lined up quite close, the Roman Catholic church decided to create a new holy day after a pagan worship date. In order to be accepted by the heathens, the missionaries created St. John's Day so the pagans could still celebrate their day. They took a pagan holiday, gave it a Christian name, everyone was happy, and no one knew the difference, except YHVH.

### **Dagon Fish god**

At the same time the heathen name Pontifex was adopted by the church, the name "Ichthys", "The Fish," or the "Fish god," "Dagon" was being used to describe our Savior, the Son of YHVH. The names were being intermingled and associated with each other. The Pope and other priests, continue to give reverence to the fish god by their continued wearing of the famous "fish god of Dagon's hat," direct evidence that paganism is still alive and well in the church. This strange looking hat (mitre), the priests continue to wear for celebrations, must make even the most liberal Catholics frown when they try to figure out what it is supposed to represent. The pagans of old understood exactly what this strange symbol was, because they often bowed down to worship it; as the god of Dagon (also known as Leviathan). Roman Catholics have for centuries eaten fish on Fridays because it represents the high day for Dagon worship.

The "mitre" shaped hat that is frequently worn by the Pontiff is the same symbol as that of the "Fish" god "Dagon" (Leviathan), of Babylonian times. One should also note that the god name "Dagon", is just too close to "Dragon" for coincidence.

The Temple of the Dagon god is referred to by Jonathan in (1Maccabees 10:84,11:4/1Sam. 5:2-5).

It is not a coincidence that the "tiara crown", which the Pope often wears is identical to the crown worn by gods and fallen angels shown in Assyrian tablets.

**1Chr. 10:10** "And they put his armor in the house of their gods and fastened his head **in the house of Dagon.**"

**Jgs. 16:23** "Now the lords of the Philistines assembled to offer a great sacrifice to **Dagon their god**, and to rejoice, for they said, Our god has given Samson our enemy into our hands."

**Josh. 15:41** "and Gederoth, **Beth-dagon** and Naamah and Makkedah; sixteen cities with their villages."

**Josh. 19:27** "And it turned toward the east to **Beth-dagon**, and reached to Zebulun, and to the valley of Iphtahel northward to Beth-emek and Neiel; then it proceeded on north to Cabul,"

## FRIGG AND FREYA



"There are two fertility goddesses in ancient European mythology— Frigg and Freya. It's likely both are one and the same.

Friday is derived from 'Freya's Day'. If you feel there is something familiar about the word 'Frigg', you wouldn't be mistaken. 'Frigging' is old English word meaning 'sexual intercourse'. The same word is occasionally today used in lieu of another word. The symbol for these two goddesses was the fish.

There are two fertility goddesses in ancient European mythology; Frigg and Freya. Many in pagan religions believe they are probably one and the same. "FRIDAY", is derived from "Freya's Day". If "Frigg" sounds kind of familiar, you wouldn't be mistaken, "Frigging" is an old English word meaning sexual intercourse. "Frigging" is commonly used as an idiom in the English language, it is often used today in lieu of the four letter word starting with "F", commonly thrown around by toxic people, drunks and heathens in ungodly places like lounges and the like. Pagan fish symbolism, including the rite of eating fish on Friday, was rife (undesirable) throughout the Roman Empire, it was therefore adopted in Catholicism like many other sexual perverse words, thoughts, idioms, and terms of the heathen Catholics and witches of old.
